Project Search Prepares for New Classes



Vodec consumers who want a community job, get ready. Your favorite services provider has **two** opportunities for real world training internships you can take part in through Project Search.

If you have never heard the name, Project Search is a national program that provides rotational internships at businesses to help high student students with disabilities transition successfully to competitive employment.

The information and application process for both locations begins in February.

Vodec has adapted the program to a wider demographic, and with the help of several community partners, installed it at both Nebraska Medicine's main Omaha campus and the Downtown Omaha Embassy Suites, by Hilton. The two locations offer opportunities in separate types of industries that require skills that can be used in hundreds of job opportunities in other Internships are unpaid, and last almost a full year.

Each annual cycle is divided into rotations. A rotation lasts several months, and gives its participants the chance to learn how to do a job, get good at it, and become comfortable enough to compete against more traditional mainstream job applicants.



The program has a great track record. Last year, all six of Vodec's interns successfully completed the program and received their graduation certificates.

Today, all six of those consumers are employed in the mainstream job force and doing well.

The process that generates such amazing results is a combination of "hands-on" coaching and enough independent repetitions of the tasks in each rotation to give a consumer confidence in their ability to do the work.



Project Search interns start and end each day with classroom work to learn and reinforce basic skills that will apply to any job; resume writing, using the internet, workplace courtesy and expectations, and dressing for the community work force.

Between classes, interns report to their rotation site and work a shift, supervised by a job coach.

That coach stays right by their side until they have mastered the daily tasks of each job. That close-quarter supervision gives Vodec's community employment teams the expertise they need as they pursue and develop job opportunities for each consumer.

The Nebraska Medicine interns can expect rotations in janitorial services, bioenvironmental cleanup, cafeteria and food service, among others.

At Embassy Suites, rotations in banquet services, janitorial, maintenance, the laundry and housekeeping are available.

If you think a Project Search Internship would be a smart step in the road to community employment for you or a loved one, your first step is to visit one or both of the two open houses scheduled for this month.



Team Perseverance is at it again! This time decorating and donating baby blankets to a local birthing center.

The group of Vodec Nebraska Residential Consumers is a self-organized effort for residents who wanted to take a personal stake in getting more involved in the community.

From the beginning, Perseverance has made it clear they want to demonstrate that having a disability doesn't mean disconnecting from the people and activities around them.

Their efforts focus on recreation, improving life skills, and most importantly — giving back.

Which brings us back to baby blankets.

Faced with the question of "who" Perseverance wanted to help, they chose another vulnerable group —newborns.

Each resident chose a theme and decorated their blanket to reflect a different attitude and personality.

Those chose Children's Hospital as the recipient for their gift.

The facility is one of the largest of its kind in the region — an area that covers five states. Every year, the hospital and medical center treat 250,000 children for various medical conditions and illnesses. Spending time in the hospital is something some of these consumers have experienced first hand. They know the difference something familiar, something comfortable, something pretty can make for an extended stay.

Vodec is proud of the engagement these consumers have taken on with the community. It would be easy enough for people facing their own individual challenges to sit back and wait for their neighbors and organizations to bring assistance to them. They have chosen instead to Persevere! Good job, team.


